<p>1. Authority SC 1327, 1327.1 Title 22 Sec. 11.31a</p>	<p>The Fairview School District Board of School Directors recognize the legal rights of parents to educate their child(ren) in their own home. The Board requires that the program of instruction be in compliance with the state laws of Pennsylvania.</p>
<p>2. Guidelines SC 1327.1</p>	<p>The Public School Code of 1949, as amended, and the State Board of Education Regulations authorize in-home instruction by a properly qualified supervisor. Such instruction shall include the subjects and activities designated and described by law for elementary and secondary school students. Instruction shall be conducted for a minimum of 180 days, or a minimum of 900 hours for elementary students, and 990 hours for secondary students. The administration will develop administrative procedures for students who will be receiving their education through in-home instruction. The Superintendent will inform the Board of School Directors of each student residing in the district for whom a supervisor has filed a notarized affidavit to provide home education in accordance with this policy.</p>
<p>Pol. 122, 123</p>	<p>Students residing in the district for whom a supervisor has filed a notarized affidavit to provide home education in accordance with this policy shall be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities, after school co-curricular activities, and interscholastic athletics offered by the district, provided that they submit timely proof of satisfying eligibility requirements for participation in these activities.</p>
<p>Pol. 122</p>	<p>For extracurricular and after school co-curricular activities, eligibility criteria are established by the district, building principal, teacher, or activity advisor.</p>
<p>Pol. 123</p>	<p>For interscholastic athletic eligibility, the district has adopted the eligibility criteria of the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, in accordance with Policy 123.</p>
<p>Pol. 122, 123</p>	<p>Students desiring to participate in extracurricular or after school co-curricular activities of the district, or interscholastic athletics offered by the school district, must submit proof of meeting eligibility criteria prior to participation. The</p>

<p>Title 22 Sec. 11.33</p> <p>AP 137.4</p>	<p>Superintendent shall establish guidelines for submission of proof of satisfaction for eligibility criteria for students who are provided their instruction in the home pursuant to this policy.</p> <p>Students residing in the district for whom a supervisor has filed a notarized affidavit to provide home education in accordance with this policy shall be permitted to dually enroll in the public school offerings of the district. Students may enroll in individual course offerings at either the elementary or secondary level. Students dually enrolling in the public school program shall be subject to all applicable district student disciplinary and conduct rules and must commit to regular attendance in the program. The supervisor of the home education program shall be made aware of applicable building bell schedules and times that the requested course(s) is(are) offered.</p> <p>The administration shall develop procedures for the attendance by home education students who seek to be dually enrolled in the public school offerings of the district.</p>
